# What is Medical Aid?

Medical aid is something used to treat a work-related injury. It includes things such as medications, specialized products and other services (like physiotherapy) that help lessen the effects of an injury.



#### When is a worker eligible for Medical Aid?

A worker is eligible for Medical Aid when the medication, product or service is reasonable necessary to lessen the effects of the work-related injury (called a compensable injury).

#### What questions does the panel ask to decide the appeal?

Typically, a panel will ask the following question:

 Does the weight of medical evidence establish that medical aid is reasonably necessary to treat or alleviate the effects of the worker's compensable injury under this claim?

#### What types of evidence are commonly used to answer the questions?

- · Occupational Therapist or other medical service provider's report
- · Prescription for specialized product, treatment or medication
- Physician's report on the need for specialized product, treatment or medication
