## A. What is a *Notice to Attend* or *Notice to Produce Documents*?

Section 13.1(5) of the *Workers' Compensation Act* gives us the legal authority to require a witness to come to a hearing or deliver documents.

We issue a *Notice to Attend* or a *Notice to Produce Documents* when we believe that a participant needs evidence or documents from a person who refuses to come to a hearing or provide documents voluntarily. We have the legal authority to require a witness to come to a hearing or deliver evidence (such as books, papers, and documents). We can also examine that witness under oath.

## B. How to Apply

Rule 3.10 of the *Appeal Rules* describes what an applicant must include when applying for a *Notice to Attend* or a *Notice to Produce Documents*.

To apply, please fill out both an *Application for a Notice to Attend or Produce Documents* and a *Conduct Money Worksheet*. The *Application for a Notice to Attend or Notice to Produce Documents* asks you to state the reasons why the notice is required, including an explanation of why a witness or a document is relevant to the appeal. In the case of a notice to produce documents, you are also asked to describe the document in question so that the person who receives the notice is able to identify the requested document without undue difficulty.

You should apply as quickly as possible if a witness refuses to come to a hearing or bring the documents for the hearing. Medical specialists or other expert witnesses may need at least 30 days to clear their schedule. We may adjourn the hearing if the applicant does not give the witness enough notice.

The Appeals Officer will ask a panel to issue a *Notice to Attend* or a *Notice to Produce Documents*. The panel's decision is final. If the panel decides to issue a notice, the applicant must pay all conduct money. Conduct money compensates a witness for their time and expense when they come to a hearing or deliver documents (see Section E). We may adjourn the hearing if the panel does not have time to make a decision on your application prior to the scheduled hearing date.

## C. Issuing a Notice

When deciding whether to issue a notice, we will consider if:

- the person receiving the notice has access to the evidence or documents
- the evidence or document(s) could significantly help resolve an issue raised in the appeal (or identify other evidence that could do so)
- the applicant asked the witness to voluntarily appear or deliver the document(s)
- the applicant asked how many pages are in the document(s)
- the evidence or document(s) are not on file
- there is no other way to get the evidence or document(s)

We may refuse to issue a notice if:

- the evidence or documents are not relevant to the appeal
- the reason for the request is insufficient
- the evidence is available from another source
- the applicant:
  - did not ask the witness to voluntarily come to the hearing or deliver documents
  - did not make enough effort to get the witness to voluntarily come to the hearing
  - is not able to provide an estimate of the number of pages in the document

- in the case of an expert witness, the applicant:
  - did not ask what their conduct money was
  - did not make enough effort to obtain the information required

If we issue a notice, the details are given to all parties so that they can prepare their cases.

## D. What Information is in a Notice?

We attached sample notices to this Practice Guideline as *Appendix A: Notice to Attend* and *Appendix B: Notice to Produce Documents*. A notice has the following information:

- the appellant's name
- the hearing time, date, and location
- the claim number or the assessment file number
- a detailed description of the documents and the date by which the witness must deliver them
- the name of the person who must come to the hearing or deliver documents
- a warning that the witness may have to come to the hearing for more than one day, or may need to come back at a future date if we reschedule the hearing
- the amount of conduct money the applicant must pay

## E. What is Conduct Money?

Conduct money compensates a witness for their time and expense when they come to a hearing or produce documents. The applicant must pay the witness conduct money when the notice is delivered (unless the panel decides otherwise). The applicant can pay the conduct money in cash or by money order.

The amount of conduct money is set by:

- for most witnesses, the *Alberta Rules of Court* (see Schedule B, Division 3 of the *Rules of Court* and the *Public Service Subsistence, Travel and Moving Expenses Regulation*)
- for expert witnesses (like doctors or engineers), their normal rates for coming to a hearing or writing an opinion (contact the Appeals Commission before applying for a notice for information about normal rates for expert witnesses)
- for documents, the Court of King's Bench Taxation Officers' suggestions.

Conduct money for a Notice to Attend includes:

Daily allowance	\$50.00 a day for each day or part of a day travelling to be at a hearing
Meals	Breakfast (if departure time is 7.30 a.m. or earlier, or return time is 7.30 a.m. or later)—\$13.00 Lunch (if departure time is 1.00 p.m. or earlier, or return time is 1.00 p.m. or later)—\$18.00 Dinner (if departure time is 6.30 p.m. or earlier, or return time is 6.30 p.m. or later)—\$28.00
Travel	By car—\$0.570 per km By public transport—reasonable fare actually paid By air—reasonable fare actually paid to regular scheduled air carrier if travel is more than 200 kms
Accommodation	If the witness cannot commute to the hearing, the estimated cost for reasonable hotel accommodation. Or, if the witness prefers private accommodation \$20.15 a night
Expert witness	Normal expert rate plus meals, travel, and accommodation as set out in this table

Under special circumstances a panel may increase allowances to witnesses.

Conduct money for a Notice to Produce includes:

Photocopying	\$1.00 a page for documents required under the <i>Notice to Produce Documents</i>
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## F. How is Notice Served?

The applicant is responsible for delivering the notice and conduct money. After we issue a notice, the applicant has up to five calendar days to give the notice and conduct money to the witness. **A notice will not be valid if it is delivered more than five days after we issued it.**

If a witness disputes receiving the notice, the applicant may have to prove it was delivered. Normally, we will accept a legal document called an Affidavit of Service (ask your Appeals Officer for a form) as proof that the witness received the notice and conduct money.

## G. How does the Witness Receive Hearing Details?

Once the applicant serves the Notice to Attend, they must contact the Appeals Officer to confirm service and provide the witness' contact information (address, email address, phone number).

The Appeals Officer will provide the witness with the hearing details, including the method of hearing, and information about how to participate.

## H. What if the Hearing is Adjourned after Notice has been Served?

If the hearing is adjourned, the witness must attend on the new date. The Appeals Officer will advise the witness of the adjournment. The applicant may need to pay further conduct money.
